Correction plan

- Each classroom will have an updated chart with each child's name, milk type, oz served and times served posted.
- On Monday 10/11/21, infant and toddler care was a main focus at our staff in-service day. We went over, in depth, proper diaper changing procedures, bottling procedures, and safe sleep for infants. We have also updated our training checklist for new hires, that covers these topics as well, to be completed within a new staff members' first 3 days. These topics will also be reviewed again in the employee's third month with us, as part of their TGT mentorship program, along with continuous check-ins from lead teachers and administration.
- Part of this training is the proper labeling and storage of milk. All milk brought in
 or made on site will be labeled with the child's name, date, ounce size, and time
 it was prepped(warmed). Prior to serving a bottle, the teacher needs to complete
 a "face to name" check, making sure the name on the bottle matches the child.
 We are also working on headshots for each child that would be used for further
 labeling in the classroom.
- Along with all the postings, our teachers are made aware of the communication that needs to be taking place when a new staff member is in their classroom or when they are being relieved for a break. We also have "communication notebooks" in each classroom, that allow teachers to continue to document updates in their classrooms and catalog any necessary information regarding the rhythms and routines of their classrooms. These books are accessible to all staff members, and anyone entering the classroom for the first time or for the first time in a while is to read them as a refresher.
